PART B

Filing by post of applications

1. Rule 969 of the Uniform Civil Procedure Rules allows for the filing of documents by post.
2. When applications are received for filing by post, the Registrar will assign a return date sufficiently in advance to allow for timely service on other parties. A minimum period of 14 days will be adopted to allow for this.
3. The return date will be entered in the applications diary and on the copies for return by the Registrar.
