Practice Direction No. 11 of 2010

Continuity and Applicability of Existing Practice Directions

- This Practice Direction is intended to assist with case management of Criminal Matters in the Magistrates Court ("the Court") by giving effect to the Criminal Jurisdiction Reform Administrative Arrangement (made Pursuant to S 706A of the Criminal Code) by continuing to give effect to existing Practice Directions which will apply to all Criminal Matters which are not subject to the Civil and Criminal Jurisdiction Reform and Modernisation Amendment Act 2010 ("the Act").
- 2. It applies to all Criminal Matters where an originating step for the proceeding is taken before the commencement of the relevant sections of the Act.
- 3. The Practice Directions in Annexure A hereto continue to have full force and effect in relation to all matters the subject of this Practice Direction.
- 4. The Practice Directions in Annexure A hereto shall have no force and effect in relation to all matters where an originating step for the proceeding is taken on or after today.
