Practice Direction Number 5 of 2013 Supreme Court of Queensland

Technology standards for using Court DVD Players for evidence presentation

- The object of this Practice Direction is to ensure that evidence presented on a CD or DVD for playback on Court DVD players is managed effectively.
- 2. Parties using Court DVD players to present evidence or other information in Court are to comply with this Practice Direction.
- 3. In sufficient time before the Court event, the party proposing to use a Court DVD player must contact the relevant Registrar to arrange a test of the compatibility of the proposed format with the Court DVD player. - 4. Evidence or other information to be presented using a Court DVD player must be readable by a standard, unmodified commercial DVD player compatible with the following standards:

Audio Formats

Playable audio format: AC3, PCM, MP2, MP3, WMA

Note: WMA supported bit rate: 32 – 192 kpbs Note: MP3 supported bit rate: 32 – 320kpbs

- Compatible disc formats: CD-DA, CD-ROM ISO 9660 Level 1&2 ROMEO/JOLIET format (CD-R/CD-RW disc compatible)
- CD-R and CD-RW discs that have been recorded in audio CD (CD-DA) format and CD-R and CD-RW discs with MP3 audio and WAV audio files.

Video and Still Image Formats

 Supported file types: jpg, jpeg, avi, divx, mpg, mpeg, mp4, mp3, wma

Note: File name is limited to 180 characters.

Note: Maximum Files/Folder: Less than 1999 (total number of files

and folders)

Note: wav (video) file format is not supported

 ISO 9660 + JOLIET, UDF and UDF Bridge format
