- Under the Coroners Act 2003 "burial" includes cremation or other lawful disposal, either in Queensland or elsewhere.
- If the body is to be cremated then the provisions of the Cremations Act 2003 must also be complied with. In particular, if a coroner's autopsy was conducted, the coroner must issue the permission to cremate under the Cremations Act 2003.
- A copy of this order must be forwarded to the Registrar General, Births, Deaths and Marriages (section 97 of the Coroners Act 2003).
