**WARRANT FOR POSSESSION**

*Property Law Act 1974*, section 146

**WARRANT TO MEMBER OF THE POLICE SERVICE TO TAKE AND GIVE  
POSSESSION**

To the Principal Police Officer at \_\_\_\_\_, in the State of Queensland (“the State”) and to all other members of the Police Service in the State.

I/we, the undersigned, being Her Majesty’s Justice (Justices) of the Peace constituting the Court (or, being the Clerk of the Court) authorise and command you on any day within [*as in Order*] clear days except on Sunday, Christmas Day, Good Friday or Anzac Day between the hours of nine in the forenoon and four in the afternoon to enter by force if necessary and with or with the aid of [*the landlord or agent of the landlord as the case may be*] or any other person or persons you deem necessary to call to your assistance into and upon the land and to eject E F and all persons claiming under or through E F together with their goods and effects and to give possession of the land to A B (or C D as such agent on behalf of A B).
