By virtue of the registry committal proceedings, the existing bail undertaking has been continued under *section 34BA* of the *Bail Act 1980* to allow the defendant to appear before the Supreme or District Court as directed by the Office of the Director of Public Prosecutions.

Therefore, the surety confirms understanding of the following:

- The registry committal varies the existing bail undertaking entered into by the defendant and the surety, to allow the bail undertaking and the respective conditions to continue until an indictment is presented to the Supreme Court, District Court or the Childrens Court of Queensland, or until the bail is varied by application or the bail is forfeited;
- The continued bail undertaking encapsulates all the existing bail conditions the defendant had agreed to uphold, until all charges on the existing bail undertaking are finalised before a court in Queensland;
- The continued bail undertaking requires the defendant to appear before the Supreme or District Court under the direction of the Officer of the Director of Public Prosecutions:
- It remains the surety's responsibility to ensure the defendant adheres to all conditions on the continued bail undertaking until all charges on the bail undertaking are finalised before a court in Queensland;
- If a court declares at any time within the existence of a registry committal continued bail undertaking, that the bail undertaking is forfeited, any money or other security provided by the surety or sureties as a condition of the bail may become forfeited and paid to Her Majesty.

All the above requirements are defined under sections 20(4), 20(5) and 34BA of the Bail Act 1980.
