REPORT ON THE OPERATIONS OF THE LAND TRIBUNAL ESTABLISHED UNDER THE ABORIGINAL LAND ACT 1991 FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2009

I INTRODUCTION

1. This is the eighteenth annual report on the operations of the Land Tribunal established under the *Aboriginal Land Act 1991*. The report covers the period from 1 July 2008 to 30 June 2009.
2. The report deals with the membership of the Land Tribunal, land claim proceedings during this year, the status of all claims received by the Tribunal to date, an overview of aspects of the operation of the *Aboriginal Land Act 1991* and various administrative matters.

II THE LAND TRIBUNAL

3. The Tribunal was established on 21 December 1991.

(a) Membership

4. The *Aboriginal Land Act 1991* (the Act) provides for the establishment of a Land Tribunal comprising:
 - (a) a Chairperson, who is appointed on a part-time or full-time basis;
 - (b) such number of Deputy Chairpersons as are appointed on a part-time basis; and
 - (c) such other Members as are appointed on a part-time basis.
5. The Chairperson and each Deputy Chairperson is a presiding Member of the Tribunal. Each presiding Member is a lawyer.
6. Each non-presiding Member must:
 - (a) have, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, suitable knowledge of Aboriginal people or Aboriginal tradition; or

- (b) have had experience, for not less than 5 years, at a high level in industry, commerce, public administration, industrial relations, the practice of a profession or the service of a government or an authority of a government.
7. By notice dated 10 July 2008, and published in the Queensland Government Gazette on 11 July 2009, the Governor-in-Council appointed me, Carmel Anne Catherine MacDonald, as part-time Chairperson of each of the Land Tribunals established under the *Aboriginal Land Act 1991* and the *Torres Strait Islander Land Act 1991* for a term of two years from 30 July 2008 to 29 July 2010. I was appointed as a full-time Member of the Land Court for a term of 15 years from 30 July 2001 and as President of the Court from 1 August 2008 for the balance of my term as a Member.
8. By notice dated 7 November 2008 and published in the Government Gazette dated 7 November 2008, the Governor in Council reappointed the following Deputy Chairpersons and Members of the Land Tribunal from 9 November 2008 until 9 May 2009 -

9. There had been no further appointments to the Tribunal as at 30 June 2009.

(b) Functions

10. The function of the Land Tribunal was to receive claims made by groups of Aboriginal people to areas of claimable land, hear claims to that land, and report to the Minister for Natural Resources, Mines and Energy and Minister for Trade in relation to each claim.

11. As explained in the seventeenth annual report, no new claims have been received by the Land Tribunal since 22 December 2006 because of the operation of s.45 of the Act. Further, the introduction of s.83L into the Act in 2007 had the effect that, with the exception of the Aboriginal land claims to Boodjamulla (Lawn Hill) National Park and Cedar Bay National Park, all other land claim proceedings before the Tribunal as at 2 November 2007 ended, and the Tribunal has no further function to perform in respect of those claims.

(c) Land claim procedures

12. Previous annual reports have discussed a number of matters relating to land claim procedures, including parties to land claim proceedings, representation of parties, the location of land claim hearings, group evidence, restriction of evidence, and the recording of proceedings. Further information about procedures is found in land claim reports. It is not necessary to repeat what was said in those reports.
13. The Tribunal's Practice Directions were published in the 1992 Annual Report and have not been amended in any substantial way. They are available from the registry upon request.

III LAND CLAIMS

(a) Claimable land and land claims

14. Sixty claims were referred to the Tribunal up to and including 22 December 2006.

16. A table setting out the details of advertising and exhibition of each land claim application, the parties, hearing and report information, Ministerial decisions and land granted, is Annexure B to this report.

(b) Tribunal Proceedings

17. No hearings have been conducted by the Tribunal in the year under review.
18. The claimants in the Cedar Bay land claim proceedings have advised that they are seeking to implement Indigenous Land Use Agreements (entered into in respect of native title proceedings) in relation to the Cedar Bay National Park. The claim proceedings have been adjourned pending the claimants' progressing their negotiations. The Tribunal continues to review the claim via teleconferences.
19. The proceedings in the Boodjamulla (Lawn Hill) claim have been adjourned following advice from representatives of the then Department of Natural Resources and Water that the Department is not prepared to provide further funding to the claimants pending the outcome of native title proceedings in relation to the National Park. The Tribunal continues to review the claims via teleconferences.

(c) Land claim reports

(e) Bulletins

23. No Bulletins were published this year.

(f) Status of claims determined by the Land Tribunal

24. At the date of this report, the Land Tribunal had recommended the grant of freehold title in respect of each of the claims about which it had presented reports. The Minister has accepted the Tribunal's recommendations in relation to every report so far provided, other than Starcke National Park where the Minister's decision is pending.
25. Section 83J of the *Aboriginal Land Act* (which was inserted into that Act by the *Cape York Peninsula Heritage Act 2007*) applies to land for which the Land Tribunal has made a recommendation to the Minister where the land is or includes part of a national park in the Cape York Peninsula Region. The section provides that before the national park is granted the land trust for the land must enter into an Indigenous management agreement with the State about the management of the national park land. The grant of the national park land is subject to a condition that the national park land must become a national park (Cape York Peninsula Aboriginal land). The requirements as to the content of an Indigenous management agreement are set out in s.83G of the Act and include matters such as a statement as to how the land is proposed to be managed, the responsibilities of the grantees of the land in relation to the land, details of the process for developing a management plan for the land and the areas of land to which general public access may be restricted.
26. Those sections apply to the following land which the Tribunal had recommended be granted – Cape Melville National Park, Flinders Group National Park, Clack Island National Park, Lakefield National Park, Cliff Islands National Park, Iron Range National Park, Mungkan Kandju National Park, Mitchell-Alice Rivers National Park and Starcke National Park. It is understood that as at 30 June 2009 there have been no grants of these national parks.

(g) Status of all land claims

27. As noted above, most of the remaining claims before the Tribunal were terminated on 2 November 2007 and the land the subject of those claims became transferable land by virtue of the operation of s.83L of the Act.
28. The provisions of s.83J apply to such transferable land if it is or includes part of a national park in the Cape York Peninsula Region with the same consequences as are set out in [24].
29. The following Table (pages 7 and 8) and Maps (pages 9 and 10) set out the status and location at 30 June 2009 of all land claims.


LAND CLAIMS RECEIVED PRIOR TO DECEMBER, 2006



IV LEGISLATION

30. As at 30 June 2009, the current published reprint of the *Aboriginal Land Act* was Reprint No. 7. The current electronic reprint was Reprint No. 7A which includes amendments in force as at 23 February 2009.
31. During the last year, the *Aboriginal Land Act* was amended by the following legislation –
 1. *Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Land Amendment Act 2008* (No. 29 of 2008). Most of the provisions came into effect on 18 July 2008. This Act introduced substantial amendments to the principal Act, most of which do not affect the claim process. Some of the more significant amendments were –
 - ss.27, 10 and 11: where relevant, deeds of grant of transferred land must show that the land is held by the grantees for the benefit of Aboriginal people particularly concerned with the land and their ancestors and descendants (s.27(3)(b)). Previously, the effect of s.27(3) was that the deed of grant of transferred land showed that the land was held for the benefit of Aboriginal people generally, not the people particularly concerned with the land. Consistently with the new s.27(3)(b), the words "for the benefit of Aboriginal people" have been removed from ss.10 and 11 of the Act.
 - ss.16A – 16I: new sections allow the Minister to declare that relevant land (DOGIT land, Aboriginal reserve land other than land declared under a regulation for s.14, Aurukun Shire, Mornington Shire lease land) is not transferable if the Minister is satisfied certain conditions exist (s.16B). Certain persons may appeal to the Land Court against a decision to make such a declaration (s.16E(1));
 - ss.39 – 40ZJ and ss.76 - 77ZH: these new provisions enable the trustees of transferred land and land granted in fee simple to deal with the land in a number of specified ways by, for example, granting leases and licences over the land and consenting to the creation of a mining interest in the land (ss.39, 76). Restrictions are imposed on the terms of such leases and licences. The land cannot be sold or mortgaged (ss.40C and 77C).
 - s.114A: this is a new section which provides that, if the parties to a proceeding before the Tribunal agree in writing that the claimable land become transferable land and the Tribunal is satisfied that the land become transferable, the Tribunal may make an order that it is transferable land. If such an order is made, the claims for the land are taken to have been dismissed by the Tribunal.

2. *Residential Tenancies and Rooming Accommodation Act 2008* (No. 73 of 2008). This Act amended the Act in minor ways only. The amendments do not affect the claim process.
3. *Greenhouse Gas Storage Act 2009* (No. 3 of 2009). These minor amendments do not affect the claim process.

V ADMINISTRATIVE MATTERS

(a) Staff

32. The part-time staff of the Land Tribunal comprises a Senior Deputy Registrar (Mr Kevin Hayden) and an Executive Assistant (Ms Glenda Jones). Those officers also serve the Land Tribunal established under the *Torres Strait Islander Land Act 1991* and the Land Court. I thank them for their assistance and support.

(b) Relationship with the Land Court and other Tribunals

33. During the year covered by this report, I sat as a Member of the Land Appeal Court and the Land Court. Mr Stephen Keim SC sat as a Member of the Land Court and conducted a hearing and preliminary conferences in Emerald and Clermont in the week beginning 2 March 2009.

(c) Administrative arrangements

34. As at 30 June 2009 the following Administrative Arrangements were in place in respect of the *Aboriginal Land Act 1991*:

the Attorney-General and Minister for Industrial Relations is responsible for administering ss.50 to 62, Part 8; ss.134 and 138 as they apply to the provisions of the Act administered by the Minister;

the Minister for Climate Change and Sustainability is responsible for administering s.132A(2) – (11); s.134 (as it applies to the provisions of the Act administered by the Minister); and

the Minister for Natural Resources, Mines and Energy and Minister for Trade is responsible for administering the *Aboriginal Land Act 1991* except to the extent administered by the Attorney-General and Minister for Industrial Relations and Minister for Climate Change and Sustainability.

35. Pursuant to the above arrangements, the Tribunal reports annually on its operations to the Attorney-General and Minister for Industrial Relations. Reports on Aboriginal land claims under the Act are provided to the Minister for Natural Resources, Mines and Energy and Minister for Trade.

(d) Review of government boards, committees and statutory authorities

36. In 2008, the Queensland government commenced an independent review of government boards, committees and statutory authorities (government bodies). The Land Tribunal was identified as one of the bodies to be reviewed.

37. On 13 January 2009, I wrote to the reviewers requesting that the Land Tribunal be removed from the review process, as the Tribunal is not a government board, committee or statutory authority and is not therefore a government body.

38. Despite this request, the review body persisted with the review. The reviewers recommended that "The Tribunal should be retained until it has dealt with the remaining two matters on which it is required to adjudicate and then it should be abolished."

(e) Budget

39. This Tribunal and that established under the *Torres Strait Islander Land Act 1991* together with the Land Court form part of the Justice Administration Output of the Department of Justice and Attorney-General. The Tribunals and the Land Court share accommodation.

40. Both Tribunals' costs for the financial year in question were \$132,638 excluding accommodation charges.

41. No fees were paid to the part-time Members of the Tribunal.

REPORT ON THE OPERATIONS OF THE LAND TRIBUNAL ESTABLISHED UNDER THE TORRES STRAIT ISLANDER LAND ACT 1991 FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2009

I INTRODUCTION

1. This is the fifteenth annual report on the operations of the Land Tribunal established under the *Torres Strait Islander Land Act 1991*. The report covers the period 1 July 2008 to 30 June 2009.

II THE LAND TRIBUNAL

2. The Tribunal was established on 21 December 1991.

(a) Membership

3. The *Torres Strait Islander Land Act 1991* (the Act) provides for the establishment of a Land Tribunal comprising:
 - (a) a Chairperson, who is appointed on a part-time or full-time basis;
 - (b) such number of Deputy Chairpersons as are appointed on a part-time basis; and
 - (c) such other Members as are appointed on a part-time basis.
4. By notice dated 10 July 2008, and published in the Queensland Government Gazette on 11 July 2009, the Governor-in-Council appointed me, Carmel Anne Catherine MacDonald, as part-time Chairperson of each of the Land Tribunals established under the *Aboriginal Land Act 1991* and the *Torres Strait Islander Land Act 1991* for a term of two years from 30 July 2008 to 29 July 2010. I was appointed as a full-time Member of the Land Court for a term of 15 years from 30 July 2001 and as President of the Court from 1 August 2008 for the balance of my term as a Member.

5. No Deputy Chairpersons or other Members have ever been appointed to the Tribunal.

(b) Functions

6. The functions of the Tribunal were to receive claims made by Torres Strait Islanders to areas of claimable land, to hear claims to that land and to report to the Minister for Natural Resources, Mines and Energy and Minister for Trade in relation to each claim.
7. Section 45 of the Act provides that a claim under the Act must be made not later than 15 years after the commencement of s.45 of the Act. Section 45 commenced on 21 December 1991. Accordingly no claims to land may now be made under the Act.

III LAND AVAILABLE FOR CLAIM

8. The Act provided a means by which claims could be made to claimable land in the Torres Strait area. The boundaries of the Torres Strait area are described in the Torres Strait Treaty, annex 9. A copy of the Treaty is set out in the schedule to the *Torres Strait Fisheries Act 1984* (Cth).
9. No land was declared to be available for claim under the *Torres Strait Islander Land Act 1991*. Consequently, no land claims were referred by the Land Claims Registrar to the Tribunal.

IV LEGISLATION

10. As at 30 June 2009, the current reprint of the Act was Reprint No. 7.
11. In the period covered by this report, the Act was substantially amended by the *Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Land Amendment Act 2008* (No. 29 of 2008), the relevant provisions of which came into effect on 18 July 2008. The Act was also amended in minor respects by the *Residential Tenancies and Rooming Accommodation Act 2008* (No.73 of 2008) and the *Greenhouse Gas Storage Act 2008* (No. 3 of 2009). None of these amendments affected the claims process.

V ADMINISTRATIVE MATTERS

(a) Staff

12. The part-time staff of the Land Tribunal comprises a Senior Deputy Registrar and an Executive Assistant. Mr Kevin Hayden is the Senior Deputy Registrar. Ms Glenda Jones is the Executive Assistant. These officers also serve the Land Tribunal established under the *Aboriginal Land Act 1991* and the Land Court. I thank them for their assistance and support.

(b) Relationship with other bodies

13. In addition to the work as Chairperson of this Land Tribunal and the Land Tribunal established under the *Aboriginal Land Act 1991*, I have undertaken work as a Member of the Land Appeal Court and the Land Court.

(c) Review of government boards, committees and statutory authorities

14. In 2008, the Queensland government commenced an independent review of government boards, committees and statutory authorities (government bodies). The Land Tribunal was identified as one of the bodies to be reviewed.
15. On 13 January 2009, I wrote to the reviewers requesting that the Land Tribunal be removed from the review process, as the Tribunal is not a government board, committee or statutory authority and is not therefore a "government body".
16. Despite this request, the Review body persisted with the review. The reviewers recommended that the Tribunal should be abolished.

(d) Administrative arrangements

17. As at 30 June 2007 the following Administrative Arrangements were in place in respect of the *Torres Strait Islander Land Act 1991*:

the Attorney-General and Minister for Industrial Relations is responsible for administering ss.47 to 59; Part 8; ss.131 and 135 as they apply to the provisions of the Act administered by the Minister;

the Minister for Climate Change and Sustainability is responsible for administering s.80(2)-(11); s.131 as it applies to the provisions of the Act administered by the Minister; and

the Minister for Natural Resources, Mines and Energy and Minister for Trade is responsible for administering the *Torres Strait Islander Land Act 1991* except to the extent administered by the Attorney-General and Minister for Industrial Relations and the Minister for Climate Change and Sustainability.

18. Pursuant to these arrangements, the Tribunal reports annually on its operations to the Attorney-General and Minister for Industrial Relations. Reports on Torres Strait Islander land claims under the Act were to be provided to the Minister for Natural Resources, Mines and Energy and Minister for Trade.

(e) Budget

19. This Tribunal and that established under the *Aboriginal Land Act 1991* together with the Land Court form part of the Justice Administration Output of the Department of Justice and Attorney-General. The Tribunals and the Land Court share accommodation.
20. Both Tribunals' costs for the financial year in question were \$132,638 which excludes accommodation charges. Approximately \$2,000 of the Tribunals' costs constituted the expenditure by the Land Tribunal established under the *Torres Strait Islander Land Act 1991*.
