Practice Direction No. 4 of 2018

Repeal of Practice Directions – electronic filing of documents in the Magistrates Court

1. The *Uniform Civil Procedure Rules and Other Legislation Amendment and Repeal Regulation (No. 1) 2018* approved by the Governor in Council on 23 August 2018 omits Division 4, Part 1, Chapter 22 of the *Uniform Civil Procedure Rules 1999*. The new Division 4 sets out the particular provisions for electronically filed documents.
2. Rule 959B provides the Principal Registrar of a court may approve an entity (a *service provider*) to electronically file documents in the court on behalf of a party to a proceeding in the court. The transitional provisions provide that an entity that has been approved as a service provider for a court is taken to be approved as a service provider by the Principal Registrar under rule 959B.
3. Rule 975E provides that approvals by the Principal Registrar mentioned in Rules 967(3) (document or class of documents to be electronically filed), 975C (1)(b) (electronic file format for sworn and affirmed documents) and 975D (3) (exempt sworn or affirmed documents and their prescribed information) must be published on the Queensland Courts website. Publication has been made by the Principal Registrar on the Queensland Courts website in accordance with Rule 975E.
4. Accordingly, the following Practice Directions are now repealed:
