- Section 24(9) of the Coroners Act 2003 provides that if a coroner orders disposal, the entity which is keeping the tissue must:
  - a. if a family member of the deceased person has told the coroner that he or she wishes to test or use the tissue for a lawful purpose or to bury the tissue—release the tissue to the family member, or the family member's representative, for the test, use or burial (burial includes cremation); or
  - b. otherwise—arrange for the tissue to be buried (burial includes cremation).
