Electronically filing Appeals and Originating Applications in the Land Court and Land Tribunal.

Practice Note 1 of 2024

INTRODUCTION

- 1. This Practice Note is issued in accordance with s 55 of the <u>Land Court Rules 2022</u> and [13] of <u>Practice Direction 5 of 2020</u>.
- 2. This Practice Note permits the filing electronically by email the following listed forms (the Forms) and explains the procedure for doing so:
 - Land Court Form 1 Originating Application
 - Land Court Form 1A Originating Application Determination of Compensation
 - Land Court Form 2 Notice of appeal to the Land Court
 - Land Court Form 4 Notice of Appeal against a Categorisation decision
 - Land Tribunal Form 1 Originating Application
- 3. This Practice Note is in addition to, and does not affect, the filing of the Forms in person or by post.
- 4. This Practice Note does not apply to Land Appeal Court Form 1 Notice of Appeal to the Land Appeal Court, as there is no capacity to receive payments electronically.

PROCESS

- 5. The Forms must be emailed to <u>Landcourt@justice.qld.gov.au</u> as a clear PDF document.¹
- 6. The subject line of the email **must** include:
 - a. The type of Appeal or Originating Application to be filed.
 - b. The name of the person filing the document (this could be a company or organization).
 - c. Identify the originating process Land Court or Land Tribunal.

Example: Land Court Categorisation Appeal – AB Citizen

- 7. Deemed date of filing:
 - a. If any of the Forms are received by the registry on or before 4:30pm on any given business day that the registry is open, they will be deemed filed on that day.
 - b. If the registry receives the Forms after 4:30pm on any given business day the registry is open, or on a day the registry is closed, they will be deemed filed the next business day the registry is open.
 - c. The time of filing is determined by the time stamp on the email received.
- 8. Once the email has been received by the registry, you will then receive an automatic reply acknowledging receipt of the email. If you **do not** receive an automatic reply, the registry has not received the email and you should check that you have used the correct email address.
- 9. Within two (2) business days from the date of filing, the registry will send you a sealed copy of the originating process via return email.

¹The Forms must be either scanned or saved as a PDF version and attached to the email. Photographs of pages will not be accepted.

²Be sure to check the legislation for when you need to serve a copy on the other party it is often within 7 days of it being filed.
